Overall Attendance this week **94%** Across the school, **1 hour 40 minutes** of learning time was lost this week through late arrivals.

We have had a wonderful first week back after the half term break! The highlight of this week has to be our new additions within the classroom. On Monday, 7 eggs were delivered and were in a very special incubator to keep them warm. We didn't know what was inside the eggs but we were very excited to find out. We didn't have to wait long as, on Tuesday morning, a had chick hatched! Throughout the week, more eggs hatched and we now have 7 happy chicks to look after. Class 1

It has been a great first week back! On Monday, we had the grand reopening of our new Year 1 classroom, we love being in our very special working space with brand new tables and freshly painted walls. We have been working hard in all of our lessons and particularly enjoyed investigating what our new book might be about in our English lessons.

In Maths, we are working hard to master adding within 20 and found using our tens frames really useful in our lessons this week.

On Thursday, we celebrated World Book Day. There were so many excellent costumes and we really enjoyed completing lots of book/vocabulary themed activities. We also took part in a Story Makers workshop and were inspired to create our own collages filled with words that describe our favourite things.



Class 2

This week we have been so busy! Of course a highlight has been world book day. Thank you to the parents and children who helped make this day so special with their outfits. We had so many different adjectives and everyone looked fantastic. We loved all coming together for assembly and explaining our words.

We have also started a new English text, Major Glad, Major Dizzy. It has been an amazing opportunity to make a prediction on what will happen in the story and giving reasons for our own views. We have had some interesting discussions around toys from the past with the children choosing their favourites.



Class 3

This week has been a really fun week in Class 3! In English, we have begun our new writing theme which is all about persuasion. To help us we will use the Big Blue Whale by Nicola Davies as our core text to follow.

In Maths, we have been continuing our multiplication and division work to break down two-digit multiplications into steps which help our problem-solving.

In Religion this week we have introduced our new topic which is all about celebrating the mass. We have learned all about the last supper and how this is reflected in mass through the communion.

In PE we started developing our ball skills and control, starting with technique and accuracy. Next week we will be starting to implement this through badminton and tennis.

The highlight of our week has been World Book Day. We have learned all about new and exciting words and collected them just like in the story, the word collector, by Peter H. Reynolds. A great week this week Class 3, well done!



Class 4

What a wonderful first week back we have had in Class 4. As usual, it's been a busy week, full of fun and hard work! We began our new units; in science, DT, English, religion and music this week.

In English, our new text is 'When the Giant Stirred' and we began with predictions about the story. We also began our new guided reading text, 'Ariki and the Island of Wonders'.

In maths this week, we focused on revision and consolidation of addition and subtraction. The children secured their understanding of using column method and deciphering word problems.

Our new science unit is 'Living Things and Their Habitats' and we began with Carol Diagrams to sort and classify a variety of living things.

Our highlight of the week has to be World Book Day! The costumes and chosen adjectives were incredible, there was clearly a lot of effort put into each and every one. The activities that we took part in throughout the day were so much fun! In Class 4 we had 'Noun Showdown' and 'Adjective Match', along with lots of reading and other

word games. A great day was had by all!

We have had a fantastic first week back in Class 6 - it has been non-stop all week!

On Monday, we were exploring the school grounds looking for the best place to put a solar panel. We then had the chance to interview Mr Dans and suggest our ideas – it was great fun!

On Wednesday, we took part in Hoops 4 Health with Cheshire Phoenix Basketball team- we learnt lots about the importance of a healthy diet and why we shouldn't smoke. We also enjoyed doing some basketball drills with the professionals.
