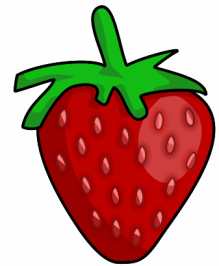
This follows on from the successful visit to St Luke's last July from the Head teacher and staff at Nkosiyethu school.
