Overall Attendance this week 93.6%.

# Reception

It has been another busy week in our classroom with lots of learning and laughter. Our check in desk has been very busy with lots of passengers jetting off to different destinations around the world. It was wonderful to watch the children pack for their holiday in the home area, jump into the taxi and head towards airport security before they boarded the plane. They demonstrated excellent language and communication skills as well as developing their writing, maths skills and their understanding of the world.

Alongside learning within the provision, the children have also been working hard on their writing with a big focus on letter formation to help when writing sentences.

We have also been rehearsing for our first Summer Fair performance and can't wait to sing for everyone this afternoon.



This week, we have been working hard on our assessments and have enjoyed having the opportunity to show all of the knowledge we have gained over the year.

Alongside assessments, we have been learning about position and direction in maths. Working with our maths buddy, we had to describe the turns made and we tried hard to use the key vocabulary from the lesson.

In this week's The Way, The Truth and The Life lesson, we have been thinking about the people who help us. We said prayers for them and then created a piece of artwork to represent how they help us.

We also really enjoyed our music lessons this week and went on a music treasure hunt around the classroom.



We have had a busy week in Class 3! In Maths, we have completed our topic on time and we have begun to explore our new topic about angles and shapes. This will explore right angles, acute and obtuse, as well as 2-D and 3-D shapes.

In English, we have been developing our skills in writing for an audience. This includes a royal invitation from the Queen of France, and a poster which persuades our audience to buy a giraffe themed product.

In Religion we have been exploring the story of the revelation of Saint Paul in more depth, and considering his actions and emotions. During this time, we have also introduced the story of the good Samaritan and explored how we can be good Samaritans in our community.

We have particularly enjoyed practicing our songs for the performance and summer fayre. A fantastic week, Class 3! Well done!



This week year 4 have been working hard on presentation and handwriting. We have been continued to learn about the Anglo Saxons, how they came to Britain on the longboats and we have had a go at some Anglo-Saxon writing.

We have been learning about the 7 Sacraments in The Way, the Truth and the Life and why they are special. We have written some questions that we would like to find out about these sacraments.

In maths we have been learning about decimals, how we can represent them in different ways and how they are connected to fractions.


In English we have been exploring the characters in our story Blue John and writing about how they may feel and what they might have seen and heard.
