

Overall Attendance this week 97.1%.

In maths year 1 have been working hard to solve problems, in particular missing number problems. Reception have been ordering numbers to 10 and counting carefully.

In geography we have been finding areas around school and year 1 have been identifying human and physical features.

In history year 1 have been talking about how we find out about the past and what evidence we can use.

Reception have been asking questions about the lives of their family and they might be bring some questions home to ask you!

We have been learning about Bonfire Night, Remembrance Day and Diwali and we have been getting very crafty to celebrate these events!



# **Elm Class**

This week Elm class have been extremely busy. In English, we have been looking at using adverbs to describe the fireworks Plop sees.

In Maths, we have continued with our addition and subtraction topic, using the different equipment to help us work out the answers.

In History, we looked at Mary Seacole and compared her life to Florence Nightingale.

In Science, we looked at different adult animals and their offspring. Before looking at the life cycle of a butterfly, chicken and frog.

In 'The Way, The Truth and The Life' we have carried on looking at the mystery of God, where we have particularly focused on the Holy Trinity.



## **Yew Class**

Another fantastic week in Yew Class. On Monday we were extremely lucky to have the opportunity plant trees in Frodsham on behalf of the Woodland Trust. We planted 250 trees in total! We all worked so well together as a team and even got to play some games after all our hard work.

In History this week, we have been looking at the tomb of Fu Hao. We identified the objects in her tomb and discussed why she was buried with these items and what they could mean to her. We also considered what these artefacts could tell us about the Shang Dynasty. We are looking forward to learning more about Fu Hao.

In Science we used our knowledge of the different types of teeth and their purposes to identify an animal's diet. We looked at the skulls of animals and observed their teeth to make connections as to whether they were an omnivore, carnivore or herbivore.

Finally, on Wednesday evening, five members of Yew class were selected to perform at Cheshire's poetry buzz event. The children were so amazing performing their poems on stage in front of an audience. Well done!







# **Cypress Class**

It has been another great week in Cypress Class. We had special visitors from Community Wind Power on Tuesday who delivered an informative workshop all about the work that they do. They were really impressed with our knowledge about renewable energy and helped us develop our knowledge further by explaining how wind turbines were made and maintained. We also had chance to drive the rover which is used to check the turbines. It had a camera and lights which we enjoyed testing out.

In our maths lessons this week, Year 6 have been exploring squared and cubed numbers before working on the formal method of multiplication whilst Year 5 have been mastering the formal method of addition and subtraction of 5-digit numbers. We found using the manipulatives really helped us to understand more and master the skill.

Today, we have enjoyed our second cricket session. We have been working on developing our technique and enjoyed applying this to the game at the end of the session.
