If somebody other than the usual parent/carer is collecting your child then their information must be logged on our contact form—please contact the school office to do this.



Overall Attendance this week **96.1%**. Across the school, **12 minutes** of learning time was lost this week through late arrivals.

80% attendance means 38 school days missed
