texts. Pathways to Read ensures engaging and purposeful reading lessons. The units can be used thematically alongside our award-winning programme Pathways to Write to encourage a whole school curriculum approach with the opportunity for topics to link across all year groups. Both programmes complement one another. Pathways to Read follows a mastery approach to learning with three categories of skills developed each half term: Ongoing skills - linked to text choices and achieved through selection of teaching activities Core skills - prediction, vocabulary development and retrieval Mastery skills - 2-3 objectives are focused on for pupils to master over the course of the half-term
