The Governors of St. Luke's Catholic Primary school believe that the wearing of a school uniform provides the value for money. While promoting a sense of pride within our school community, and in the interests of Health and Safety, it allows pupils to access all areas of the curriculum.

<u>Uniform</u>

In order to maintain a strong sense of identity and belonging within our school, we require all pupils to wear school uniform which consists of;

- Maroon School Sweatshirt
- Maroon School Cardigan
- White Shirt
- School Tie
- Grey Trousers (leggings must Not be worn as school uniform)
- Grey Skirt
- Grey Pinafore
- Black, flat sensible, safe, shoes (for health and safety reasons, trainers are Not to be worn)

Summer Options

- Grey Shorts
- Gingham Dresses Pink
- Maroon School Cap to protect from the sun
- Black, flat sensible, safe, shoes (for health and safety reasons trainers are Not to be worn)

PE Kit

- White School Polo Shirt
- Black School Shorts
- Yellow Sweatshirt with hood
- Trainers for outdoor games only these may be worn during breaks and lunch, pupils to change into school shoes afterwards.
- Plimsolls for Indoor PE this is for health and safety reasons

Jewellery

Jewellery should not be worn to school.

- Should a pupil have pierced ears, plain studs may be worn and in order to comply with health and safety regulations. These ideally should be removed by parent prior to the planned PE session, otherwise they must be covered with a plaster during all PE activities.
- Teaching staff must Not take responsibility for removing any jewellery

Make Up

- Make up or nail varnish should **Not** be worn
- For health and safety reasons False Nails must Not be worn.
- Pupils are **Not** to wear Stickers or Transfers

Equipment

- Pencil cases if advised (usually Y5/6) should be of a standard size in order to not take up valuable desk space. Most children will only require standard equipment which is provided by school.
- No knives or sharp blades should be brought into the school in any circumstances
- Mobile phones should not be brought into school without the permission of the Head teacher
- Pupils who have received permission to bring their phone to school (Y6) will be requested to hand their phone into the school office where it will remain securely throughout the school day.
- No 'swap' cards, unless there has been phase group permission
- No inappropriate books, videos or magazines
- No money should be brought to school unless for a specific permissible purpose
- School Bags (maroon with school logo) vary in size Book bags for EYFS/KS1/Satchel Y2/3/4/ Backpack Y5/6

Hair

- We recommend that hair should be neat and tidy and worn with no extremes of style or colour.
- Long hair should be tied back during Physical Education lessons for safety

Role of the Class Teachers and Support Staff

- Set a good example in term of dress
- Remember that in our respective roles we serve the local community as a set of professionals
- Not wear track suits unless during a morning or afternoon session where Physical Education is being taught.
- No jeans or denim to be worn please.

Midday Assistants will wear a High Viz Jacket when on playground duty

Role of the Head teacher and Governing Body

- The Head teacher to ensure that pupils comply with the uniform policy agreed by the governing body.
- The Head Teacher has a duty to enforce the school uniform throughout the school community, as part of the duty within maintenance of day-today discipline in the school.

Role of the Parents/Guardians

 To ensure that their child / children adhere to the school's uniform policy. Ensure that they come to school in uniform everyday unless there are special circumstances such as Christmas parties or charity fun rising.

Racial Equality & Equal Opportunities

• All children have equal access to wearing school uniform regardless of their culture, race, religion, gender, disability or ability.

Value for Money
