Overall Attendance this week **93.6%**
Across the school, **20 minutes** of learning time was lost this week through late arrivals.

Our highlight of the week was definitely finding out that our class won the FoSL coin snake challenge! It was a great team effort in making the snake (and picking them all back up again, too!).



Class 1

Great news - our class won the FoSL coin snake challenge! Alongside our friends in Reception, we created a coin snake that measured 31 metres long! It took lots of teamwork to create the snake and we were very proud to be announced the winners.

Alongside creating the winning coin snake, we have been planning our own stories ready to write our hot tasks next week, learning more about Jesus when he was younger and exploring how things feel in our science lesson.

This week's art lesson focused on mixing two different colours together and we enjoyed using the paint to make our own creations. It has been another wonderful week.

Class 2

This week we have been very busy. We particularly enjoyed making our money snakes again. We practiced our counting and organizing skills. Our snake was 20 meters long and slithered all around the classroom!

We have started practicing our handwriting using special bubble paper every day. We cannot wait to do more.

In our computer sessions we have been able to program and debug a robot drawing a triangle, square and a hexagon. Mr Taylor was amazed!

Class 4

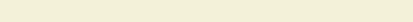

In science we carried out an investigation, testing and observing ice cubes melting. This followed on from our previous lesson when we melted chocolate. We recorded our results and discussed the scientific processes that took place during our investigation.

In English, we completed our hot task. This is an accumulation of all of our learning in this unit and our final piece of writing from 'Escape from Pompeii'. The children have worked incredibly hard and I am looking forward to reading all of their writing!

We also finished our final piece of art work and evaluated our skills, thinking about how our skills have progressed over the course of this unit.

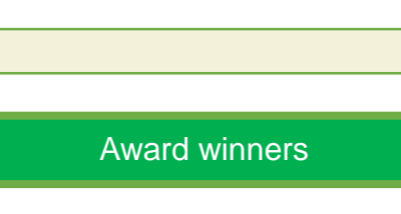
Class 6
