In maths, we have been exploring doubles and used different materials to show doubles of different numbers. What a great week!

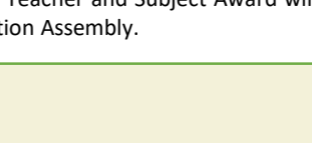


Class 1

It's been a busy week in Class 3!

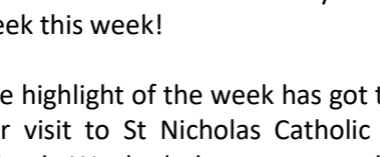
In Maths, we have completed our topic on multiplication and division and have begun exploring our new topic of length and fractions.

This half term is flying by, we can't believe there are only 8 more school days left!!



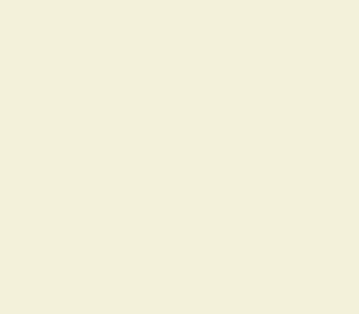
Class 6
