Cherry Class

In English have started our new story -Toys In Space. We have been asking questions and writing conversations between the characters.

Reception have been creating number stories to 10 and representing them on a tens frame. Year 1 have continued with the multiplication unit and have been creating and recognising equal groups.

We have enjoyed visiting our library and the Reading Castle this week and getting cosy with a book.

In Science we have been studying features of plants and we looked at a few wild flowers that we found in our school grounds. We then carefully created an observational drawing and labelled the main parts of the flower.

We have started to learn about China in Geography and have found out some interesting facts. We have located China on a world map and identified that China is in Asia.

We enjoyed our visit to church this week to celebrate the Ascension of Jesus. We have been talking about how the disciples might have felt and discussed any big surprises we have had in our lives and how they made us feel.



Elm Class

Year 2 have been working very hard this week. In Maths, they have been looking at mass and capacity, working on comparing if things are heavier or lighter and they are doing a great job!

In English, Year 2 have been learning all about homophones, how words sound the same but mean different things and are spelt differently.

In Science this week, Year 2 have planted their own petunia seeds and are watering them daily, waiting to observe as they grow.

In History, Year 2 have made fantastic fact files about the early life of Christopher Columbus, making sure they include significant dates.

It was another successful week in arts and crafts club! The children made wonderful mini windmills; they look great!



Yew Class

In science we have been continuing or topic on electricity. This week we have been looking at circuits. We were given components of a circuit and were asked to connect all the parts together without any instructions. A few of us managed to light our bulbs on the first try! We then discussed that an electrical circuit is the flow of electricity. We were introduced to the components of the circuit; wires, a bulb and a cell. We then observed what happened to the bulb when they circuit was completed correctly. We drew a diagram and wrote an explanation in our science books.

In history, we started our topic on William the Conqueror. We labelled a timeline of significant historical events during his reign. We also discussed that throughout our topic we are going to use primary and secondary sources. We organised our sources into the two categories and discussed the advantages and disadvantages of both. Year 4s also considered the impact of bias in primary and secondary sources.

In English we have enjoyed learning about the rainforest for our non-chronological report. We discussed the use of precise vocabulary, facts and formal language. We researched threats to the rainforests on the ipads and created posters in our groups which we all presented to the class.



Cypress Class

We have really enjoyed the long awaited arrival of some sunnier weather in Cypress Tree Class this week and couldn't wait to get outside to complete our science investigation. Linking with our topic of light, we explored the change in shadows throughout the day and measured at every hour to see how they moved/ changed. Despite one occasion (where the sun decided to hide behind to clouds for a couple of minutes), we were able to measure our shadows really easily thanks to the beautiful sunshine. Next week, we are going to be presenting our data using charts and graphs.

In our English lessons this week, we have been focusing on using different grammatical features to improve our writing and wrote excellent setting descriptions based on an animated video clip called 'Treasure'.

There has been a lot of excitement and enthusiasm within class this week as we introduced a new way to complete our SPaG starters after lunch. Using the 'Play Live' activity on Rollama, the class have enjoyed working through the activities set to improve their knowledge of punctuation and grammar - and it is already helping to improve their writing, too!
