Cherry Class

We have been enjoying our Toys in Space story in English. We have created our own space creature and used adjectives to describe them. We have been working especially hard with spelling tricky words and using our phonics knowledge correctly.

Reception have been using positional language to direct each other around mazes and treasure maps. Year 1 have been creating tricky arrays and representing them using pictures.

In Science we have been sorting different plants according to different criteria. We can't believe there are so many different types of plants that all look different!

We have started to learn about holidays in the past and we have begun to compare some differences between holidays past and present.

We have been practicing our skills in art using paper to create patterns and shapes in different ways. We will use these skills to design and create our own paper sculpture.

We have been talking about Mental Health Awareness and ways that we can keep mentally healthy. We focused on eating healthily, moving in different ways and how exercise and movement makes us feel.

Year 2 have had a busy week this week.

In Science, we have started an experiment where we have planted seeds, and are going to grow them in different conditions to see if this impacts their growth. The children made some fantastic predictions for which plant should grow the best.

In Geography, we have used interactive maps to find physical features along the coastline of Cornwall, we found lots of beaches, cliffs and caves!

Our English and Maths have looked a little bit different this week as Year 2 have completed four of their summer assessments, I am so proud of them! They have two more next week and I know they will be amazing.



Yew Class

In geography this week, we learned about food exports and imports. We deduced that 'import' means to bring goods and services to a country, while export means to provide other countries with goods. We reviewed our learning from last lesson about climate zones and ideal growing conditions for crops to consider why the UK imports food. We were shown pictures of different foods and tried to determine whether they are imported to the UK or exported to other countries. We were then provided with a list of the UK's most popular imports and exports and located these countries on a world map by using an atlas. We used the contents page to help us find the different continents.

In art we experimented different ways of joining card by to make 2d shapes freestanding. We joined our card by creating slits and slotting them together, gluing and curving the card. We investigated circuits. We looked at a picture of an incomplete circuit and discussed whether we thought the bulb would light We discovered that all the components in a circuit need to be connected correctly for a bulb to light or a buzzer to make a sound. We were given pictures of incomplete circuits. We predicted whether we though the bulbs would light. We then built the circuit and observed what happened. We drew diagrams and labelled them and wrote an explanation of our observations

Whilst Year 6 completed their SATs, Year 5 have also been working hard. They have been exploring shapes in Maths and enjoyed using the manipulatives to explore the number of faces, vertices and edges of 3D shapes. In this week's English lessons, they have been working on a special poetry project. Using Michael Rosen as inspiration, they have created poems about their family members and what they often say/ do which makes them laugh. They were so enthusiastic to share them with each other so part of the lesson was dedicated to performing them in front of the class.

During the afternoons, we have enjoyed being back together to continue with our foundation subject lessons. In science, we used the data that we collected last week to draw our own line graphs and look at the results in more detail. We have also been finding out more about our new focus artists and have been appraising their work.
