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Dates for your diary

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Marigold Class

The children seemed to have had a lovely half term holiday and have come back to school settled and ready to learn.

English—We have started our new book Look Up and we have been talking about what we can see when we look up! (We have had lots of ideas about fireworks and rockets!) We have been predicting what the story might be about.

Maths—Reception have been recognising numbers and playing pairs games to match the number to the image.

Year 1 have been recognising pairs to 10 and writing number sentences to match.

Year 2 have been practicing using facts that we know to 10 to find other facts to 100.

Science—We were wondering why some trees lose their leaves in the autumn so we have been researching and recording why this happens.

The Vines and Branches—We have enjoyed some reflection time this week learning about the Holy Trinity and how we can understand what this means for us. We have also listened to the story of Elizabeth and have acted out the story and how they might have felt to receive the news.



Tulip Class

Tulip class have had a positive and settled start to this half term. In Maths we have been focusing on our MICE, exploring a wide range of vocabulary, experimenting with manipulatives, considering how many different calculations we can use, and ensuring our explanations are detailed. We used sentence stems to help us, and were really interested to hear one another's ideas about solving different types of problem.

In English, we have started our new topic and discussed our new mastery keys, as well as exploring new vocabulary linked to our text (which is still a mystery!). The vocabulary was themed around space, which has given us some clues... Later in the week, we used iPads to research some facts about Neil Armstrong and space, which we will use in our writing next week.

In Science, we started our Biology unit; Animals including humans. We discussed different types of nutrition our bodies need to survive including carbohydrates, fruit and veg, and protein. We designed eat-well plates, in year three focusing on how we categorise the foods we eat, and in year 4 creating simple keys to help us to organise our work.

We can't wait to see what else is in store for us this half term!





Bluebell Class

After taking some time to recharge after a busy first half term, we are happy to be back together ready to start Autumn Term 2. This week, we have had a science themed week where we have enjoyed finding out how to separate different materials, making our own filters and investigating the solubility of a material. For each investigation, we made a predication about the results and then worked on using scientific vocabulary to explain our findings.

Last half term, we finished Holes, our first class novel of the year, and thoroughly enjoyed it. This week, we completed our final whole class reading session linked with the text and reflected on the different themes and stories within the book. We completed 'The ultimate end of book quiz' and it was great to see how much everyone was able to recall from the text.

After completing this fantastic text, we started our new class novel called 'Nevermoor: The trials of Morrigan Crow'. Described as a 'wonderful, warm-hearted magical adventure..', we can't wait to read more over the next few weeks.

It was our last swimming session this week and focused on developing life saving skills. The class were asked to wear pyjamas over their swimming kits and completed a number of different tasks that demonstrated what to do if they (or someone else) were in danger in water. Over the last 8 swimming sessions, it has been great to see everyone make progress in their swimming. They have worked hard to master the techniques and their confidence in the water has increased. Well done, everyone!
