### **English**

We are enjoying reading and writing about our new book 'Major Dizzy Major Glad' We have been practicing suffixes -ed and -ing as well as subordination (Year 2) to write sentences about the toys. Reception have been writing super sentences and are now working on writing some words independently.

#### **Maths**

Year 2 have continued learning about multiplication and division and the relationship between the two and they are becoming much more confident with this. Year 1 have been working on counting in 10s and 1s, and writing larger numbers correctly. Reception have continued to write number sentences in their Maths books and have been representing them using objects.

### **Vines and Branches**

We have been learning about reconciliation and what this means. We have thought about things we might be sorry for, forgiveness, and have been learning the Act of Contrition prayer.


### Science

We have been learning about how we know plants are living things and which 7 processes all living things can do. We were surprised by some of them as we didn't know that plants could breathe but we talked about how they use these processes in different ways.

### Geography

We have been comparing what weather is like by the coast of Llandudno compared with Frodsham. We looked at data that showed weather patterns over the year and we also compared the weather forecast for this week. We found out that Frodsham is actually slightly warmer than Llandudno, has less rain and less wind. Reception were comparing hot and cold countries and have been sorting out photographs into groups.

## **Tulip Class**



This week, Tulip class have been focusing on Fractions in Maths. In year 4, we have been looking at equivalence and simplifying fractions. We discussed what the simplest version of a fraction could mean by calculating common factors. In Year 3, we talked about what Unit fractions were and how we can order them by size. Year 3's have been using the keywords 'numerator' and 'denominator' in their answers.

In English, we have carried on reading 'Big Blue Whale' and have spotted key literary techniques including similes and discussed the effect this has on the reader. We then created our own similes using different pronouns and expanded noun phrases, and turned these into poems! We enjoyed sharing these with our peers. Later in the week, we looked at how adverbs can help us to structure our writing and add clarity to sentences.

In Science, we have progressed our learning about light. We used mirrors and torches in a dark room to see how light reflects off different surfaces, and how it behaves when multiple mirrors are placed together. We also made the most of the sunny weather this week and went outside to see how our shadows looked. We traced around them with chalk to compare the shadow's size to our own bodies. We discussed the angle of light and what happens when it hits opaque objects (i.e. us!).

In Personal Development, we discussed things we see online and in the media such as advertising and social media images and videos. We discussed how God created us to be ourselves and shouldn't change based on things we see online as they are not always a true representation.

## **Bluebell Class**

















We have had another great week in Bluebell Class. The beautiful sunshine and subtle signs of Spring have really lifted our spirits and helped us to embrace the learning opportunities given.

It has certainly been a week for resilience and determination in Maths as Year 6 have been working on algebra. Working through different strategies, the class have demonstrated an excellent attitude to learning and it has been wonderful to see them making progress as the week goes on. Year 5 have also been working hard focusing on how to multiply fractions by integers. At first, the questions looked challenging but, after some discussion and a bit of practise, many felt more confident and mastered the skill.

We are really enjoying our new English text: 'The Darkest Dark'. With a focus of writing for a specific audience and purpose, we used all of our knowledge of different grammatical features to write about Chris Hadfield's early life, using information we had lifted from the text. All of this will help us when we come to write our hot tasks in a few weeks' time.

The highlight of the week for many was our art lesson as we were introduced to a new artist: Georgia O'Keeffe. After reading about her inspirations and the medium that she uses, we were all really excited to create our own artist appreciation pages within our sketchbooks. As the year goes on, it is great to see how everyone's creativity is making progress and the pages created are beautifully presented.
