This week was assessment week and Year 3 and 4 worked really hard at their Maths, Reading, Spelling, and Grammar & Punctuation papers. Everyone was focused and tried their hardest.

During Science, we focused on the sun as a light source, and discussed the importance of protecting ourselves when we are outside. We designed promotional posters to persuade people to buy sun cream and sunglasses which are important in protecting us from UV rays.

During Geography we continued our work on volcanoes. We looked at the reasons why people would want to live near them, such as having a beautiful view and the rich soil which is perfect for farming. We then looked at the reasons why people would not want to live near a volcano, such as the chance of their homes being destroyed and it is dangerous.

On Thursday, Year 3 played football at Helsby High School against other local primaries. We enjoyed playing football with our classmates, and scoring goals. Thank you to the parents who came to help us on this trip.

Year 4 experienced a transition day at St Nicholas's Catholic High School. They did some sporting activities inside the Sports Hall including; a vertical jump, shot put, tunnel running, javelin, and curling. They also took part in an art lesson where they recreated artwork in the style of Jon Burgerman. To finish off the day, they took part in a Catholic Life lesson where they wrote down prayers about Jesus's journey to the cross and Lent. Finally, they created boxes to represent acts of kindness that they could do in their everyday life.

Bluebell Class



It has been assessment week in Bluebell Class this week and, although it isn't the most enjoyable of tasks, everyone has worked hard to try their best and apply the knowledge they have acquired over this term. Year 6 have focused on SATs papers and it has been great to see so many people asking to go through different questions after the test so that they can really master the strategy and use it on future tests.

Alongside completing assessments, we have been very busy in other subjects, too. In our history lesson, we were investigating the reasons why King Henry VIII made the decision to break away from Rome and the Catholic Church. Using different sources, we explored the problems he faced and how he solved them (which was often a controversial decision!).

On Tuesday, we explored The Beatitudes that Jesus taught us in our *The Way, The Truth and The Life* lesson. We enjoyed learning about the meanings and discussed how they could be applied to different situations in everyday life.

In this week's personal development lesson, we focused on the importance of sleep and maintaining personal hygiene to keep our bodies healthy, happy and hygienic. We enjoyed creating our own fact sheets to support others of a similar age and inform them of the tips that we had found out and there were some great designs to really capture the reader and give the information in an engaging way.

This highlight of the week was seeing our amazing maths quiz team return victorious after winning the final of the Inter Primary Maths Competition held at Helsby High School. They sailed through to the final after winning their heat and we had everything crossed for them on Tuesday afternoon. We were absolutely delighted when they returned and shared the news that they were this year's CHAMPIONS! Congratulations to our team for an outstanding performance - we are so proud of you!
