Marigold Class

Marigold Class has had a fantastic time this week visiting Eureka Science

Museum! We watched a hands-on show

about our 5 senses and explores the galleries. Our favourite areas were the Burrow, the treehouse, Luna the giant cat and the door of fears!

In English we have been cutting out pictures of our visit and writing a recount of all of the things we did and enjoyed.

In Maths year 2 have been learning about statistics and learning how to use data to answer a question and find information. Year 1 have been exploring money and recognising different coins. Reception have been using Maths and objects to solve number problems.

In The Vine and the Branches we have been learning about the conversion of Saul on the road to Damascus. We have talked about the power of God's forgiveness and what Paul (formerly Saul) went on to do in his life following Jesus. We have also been learning about the Holy Trinity and created a pattern to help us understand that the father, the son and the Holy Spirit are all one God.

We are enjoying My Happy Mind and use our happy breathing techniques regularly. We have been learning about how the different parts of the brain work together and how we can regulate our feelings.

In art we have been painting our final pieces using white and black to change the shades of colours. We have given our pieces name and are excited to display them in the Marigold Art Gallery.

Tulip Class



This week, Tulip class were off to an exciting start with a whole-school trip to Eureka! We enjoyed

exploring the interactive rooms and discovering more about nature, our bodies, and the home. We watched a show that was all about animal habitats which linked well to our Science week projects.

In English, we have read to the end of Journey! We were excited to discover that there could be more magic crayons out there ... We focused on speech this week, and year 4 were adding detail to their

reported clauses and using the past progressive tense.

In Maths, Year 3 have continued learning about fractions and have been exploring adding and

subtracting them, as well as partitioning the whole. Year 4 have been comparing and ordering decimal numbers, and have started to round them.

In the Vine and Branches, we began looking at Judaism this week and exploring the Passover, and what God's mission to Moses was. We painted our own interpretations of the 'Burning Bush' and explained what the nine plagues were.

In Geography, we have continued to explore Antarctica, using atlases and the index page to find out more information about it's climate and the features that are there. We used iPads and Google Earth to discover the man-made bases that are there, and were shocked to discover that no one lives there because it is too cold!

In History, we have carried on looking at the History of Frodsham and have enjoyed finding out who owned it during Anglo-Saxon times. We enjoyed hearing some information about William the Conqueror and how he links to our local town!

Year 3 had a special visit on Thursday from PSCO Neil, who taught them about road safety and the importance of checking carefully before they crossed the road. They did some exciting activities back in school too and even won some prizes.
