Saint Carlo Acutis

The canonization of Blessed Acutis, a teenager known for his devotion to the Eucharist and creating an online exhibition of Eucharistic miracles, had originally been scheduled for April 27 during the Jubilee of Teenagers but

was postponed following the death of Pope Francis. During the past academic year the children have been praying to Blessed Carlo Acutis, they will now pray to Saint Carlo Acutis.

Saint Pier Giorgio Frassati

Blessed Frassati, born in 1901 into a prominent family in Turin, Italy, was admired for his deep spirituality, love for the poor and enthusiasm for life. A member of the Dominican Third Order, he served the sick through the St. Vincent de Paul Society. He died at age 24 after contracting polio, possibly from one of the people he assisted.



On Friday 19th September, we are looking forward to welcoming Bishop Mark to our school. This will be an opportunity for him to meet with children and staff. On Sunday 21st September Bishop Mark will be celebrating mass in St. Luke's parish church at 11 am. All families are invited to attend, a special invitation is extended to those children who celebrated their First Holy Communion last academic year.


Attendance

St Mary's Class





This week we have welcomed Rachel from Life Education to St. Luke's Catholic Primary School. The children in St. Mary's Class, along with all the other classes in school went along to meet Harold and to find out what great advice he had to share.

The Children in Reception class sat and listened attentively as they found out about their body and how it works. Harold talked to year one about the importance of Health Eating! Everyone was keen to talk about their healthy choices. With year two, Harold explored feelings. Harold was really impressed with the answers they shared.

St Elizabeth's Class



St Elizabeth class have had a fantastic and settled start to the new school year! During our first week, we did lots of exciting activities to get to know one another a little bit better and ease ourselves into the new term. We read 'Oh the Places You'll Go' by Dr Suess and created some hot air balloons that talked about what we wanted to be in the future! We read some different stories to teach us about kindness and volume. We enjoyed our prayer and liturgy sessions reflecting back on the summer holiday and looking ahead to the new school year. On Friday, we had a special Pilgrims of Hope day and we created some artwork, wrote prayers and pledges of hope, and created some leaflets to teach people about foodbanks.

This week, we have settled well into our new lessons and brand new topics. In Maths, Year 3 have been exploring place value to 1000 using place value counters, base ten and place value grids to represent numbers. Year 4 have been looking at place value to 10,000 using similar equipment.

In English, we have started to read our new class text: Gorilla. We wrote some expanded noun phrases to describe character and setting, and have been creating our own 5 part stories using an image to help us. We have also enjoyed our spelling lessons this week, looking at words that have 'ou' in the middle that sounds like 'ow.' We started our guided reading lessons, and enjoyed the extract from the BFG. We have also started our class novel (Planet Omar, Accidental Trouble) and are enjoying hearing about Omar starting his new school!

In History, we have started our new topic of the Shang Dynasty and so far have learnt that they made their home by the Yellow River, and that the Shang Dynasty was led by kings. We found China in atlases and looked at some of its key features.

We have also started our new art topic of drawing, and have completed an artist study of Paul Cezanne. We enjoyed being creative with our double page spreads, and learning more about his artwork and his life.

St Catherine's Class

St. Catherine Class have had a fantastic start to the new academic year, settling into new routines and showing great enthusiasm for their learning. It has been a very busy week that has got everyone thinking, sharing, and working hard.

In maths, we have started our Place Value topic. Year 5 have been challenged to work with numbers up to 1,000,000, while Year 6 have stretched themselves even further, exploring numbers beyond 1,000,000. The class have shown great determination in tackling these big numbers and applying their knowledge in different contexts.

We have enjoyed our Life Education workshops this week, with one of the sessions focused on keeping safe online. These important sessions gave everyone practical strategies and useful reminders for how to look after themselves and others in the digital world. We also had our first MyHappyMind lesson of the year, which explored the different parts of our brain and how 'Team H-A-P' work together to help us feel calm. We enjoyed participating in happy breathing and reflected on how this can help us feel calmer and support the different parts of our brain to work together.

One of the favourite times of the day for many is when we share our class novel, *Wonder*. This text has already become a firm favourite, as the class listen, reflect, and discuss the powerful themes of kindness, empathy, and acceptance.

We are looking forward to an exciting year ahead, full of challenges, learning, and opportunities to shine.
