Called Knit-for-Nout.


Worry monsters are important to the wellbeing of children and help them

# St Mary's Class

We have been delighted to welcome our new reception children to St. Luke's and they have settled in brilliantly! We already have a routine and they have been enthusiastic about learning new things.

We enjoyed voting for our new class name and, almost unanimously, we voted for St. Mary Class!

We were very excited to meet Bishop Mark today and hear all about him. We have spend time learning about the role of the Bishop and that the Pop is the head Bishop and lives in Rome. Reception also enjoyed their first visit to mass this week, walking with their buddies - who were excellent at looking after the children.



### **English**

We have started our new text Lost and Found and we have enjoyed acting out the story and pretending to be the

characters to come up with ideas about what they might say. Reception have been storming ahead learning their letters in phonics and have even started blending some words!

#### Maths

We have been focusing on place value and learning what the digits really mean. We have revamped our journaling technique and the children are enjoying having discussions about their maths challenges.

In The Vine and the Branches we have been learning about Creation story according to the book of genesis and we have enjoyed exploring our own world for signs of things that God has made.

We loved having a visit from Life Education and meeting Gerald Giraffe. The children learned about their bodies and how to stay healthy.





#### Art

We have enjoyed studying our new artists - Paul Klee (EYFS) and Romero Britto (Year 1/2) and we have been working hard on our 2 page spreads, exploring the artist's techniques, shapes and colours. We are looking forward to exploring sketching skills and creating our own designs.

### St Elizabeth's Class



This week in English St Elizabeth class have been reading further into our book 'Gorilla' and discussing how imagery and language is used to convey the feelings of characters. We have also enjoyed researching some facts and information about gorillas and using these to create a leaflet.

In Maths, Year 3 have been flexibly partitioning hundreds, as well as familiarising ourselves with a number line to 1000. Year 4 have been flexibly partitioning numbers to 10,000 and finding 1, 10, 100 or 1000 more or less than given numbers.

In spelling, we have looked at words that sound like /u/ but are spelt with 'ou.' We used words such as 'young,' 'trouble,' and 'country' in sentences and practiced clapping out the syllables.

In the Vine and Branches this week we read the Creation Story from Genesis. We explored some of the poetic and repetitive language used, and discussed its meaning. We then took a sensory walk around school, noticing what we could see, hear, smell, touch and taste. We reminded ourselves that these things were God's gift to us. We ended our walk in the hut and had a reflective prayer session to thank God for his gifts and remind ourselves to appreciate and care for them.

We also spent some time this week learning about the role of a Bishop, ahead of the Bishop's visit this morning! We were fascinated by some of the facts that we learnt, and took part in a class quiz to see how much we had remembered.

## St Catherine's Class

It has been another busy week in our class. One of the highlights has been the Year 6 Junior Leader elections. We are proud of all the candidates who put themselves forward for this important role and presented to our school community. After the presentations, the whole school had the chance to vote, and the results were carefully counted and verified. We are delighted to announce that Astrid and Louis have been elected as our new Junior Leaders—congratulations to them both!

The rest of Year 6 also have special leadership opportunities. Each member of the year group has been given an ambassador role, which they are excited to begin. These positions will give them the chance to take on more responsibility around the school and to be positive role models for younger pupils. We look forward to seeing them grow in confidence as they take on these important duties.

We have also enjoyed our learning within the classroom this week. In English, we have been focusing on using expanded noun phrases to describe a scene, and we are looking forward to reading more of our focus text as the story unfolds. Handwriting has been a big focus and it is great to see everyone working hard to ensure their handwriting is cursive, clear, legible and of a consistent size.

We also completed our first Vine and Branches lesson, where we recapped the story of Abraham and explored how this marked the beginning of The Period of Patriarchs. It was a thoughtful start to our new topic, and we are eager to build on this learning in the weeks ahead.

Today, we really enjoyed welcoming Bishop Mark to our school. He shared all about his duties and how he carries out his ministries, and it was really interesting to hear about the different parts of his role. It was a very special experience and made us feel proud to be part of our school community.
