
Thank you to the parents who attended our curriculum evening this week. We hope you found it to be informative. The slides shown will be available on your child's class page on our website.


### **Attendance**

# St Mary's Class



#### **English**

We are enjoying our text - Lost and Found and we have been pretending to work at the lost and found office and write labels and descriptions of the animals. We have also been writing lists of things we might need to take to the South Pole.

#### Maths

Year 2 have been partitioning tens and ones and recognising which numbers are bigger and smaller.

Year 1 have been working on Part Whole Models and finding the missing parts. They have been representing these using objects and images. Reception have been working on counting carefully and representing numbers in different ways.

In The Vine and the Branches we have been learning about how beautiful God's World is and we have listened to some psalms. We have had a go at writing our own psalm saying thank you to God.

#### Science

We have been learning about different materials and their properties. We found different items around the room that had similar properties and we then chose an item and talked about why its properties made it a good material for that item.

#### Computing

We enjoyed exploring Purple Mash for the first time today. We used our log ins and explored the different areas including MiniMash. We completed a To Do and created a picture using Paint.





## St Elizabeth's Class



This week in English we have read much further into Gorilla and were excited to hear about the wonderful things that Hannah and her Gorilla friend got up to! We worked on using expanded noun phrases to describe a setting, and in year 4 we were embedded fronted adverbials.

In Maths, Year 3 have started a brand new topic of addition and subtraction of three digit numbers using skills we have already learnt throughout place value. Year 4 have been starting to round numbers which we have found tricky but are starting to understand the patterns and rules.

In Science this week, we started to explore how states of matter can change. We measured the temperature of water at room temperature, and predicted how this could become a gas. Some of us correctly predicted that the water needed to be heated for it to become water vapour. We watched a kettle boil and saw the steam coming out of the top. We learnt that the boiling point of water is 100 degrees celcius!

In the Vine and Branches, we learnt about stewardship. We read from Genesis and learnt that God left us a special instruction to care for the planet. We made handprint pledges to share the things that we could do in our own lives to look after our world.

In History this week, we were looking at the materials that were used during the Shang Dynasty including bronze and jade. We designed our own bronze helmets using patterns that were typical of that time period.

In Art, we have continued to study Paul Cezanne and complete observational drawings. This week, we sketched from objects around the classroom and looked at them from different angles to think about perspective.

## St Catherine's Class

It has been another busy week in St. Catherine Class! The children have been hard at work across a wide range of subjects, showing creativity, enthusiasm, and teamwork throughout.

In English, we have really enjoyed becoming journalists by writing reports about last week's Cheshire Ploughing Match for the local press. The class



explored what makes a successful report by investigating the key features needed, before producing some excellent pieces of writing. Everyone worked hard to adopt the style of an article, and the results were both professional and engaging.

Everyone has also been working hard in maths this week. Using their maths journals, we have explored different strategies for solving problems. We particularly enjoyed breaking down challenging questions and thinking carefully about which methods were the most effective and efficient to use. This reflective approach has helped everyone build both confidence and problem-solving skills.

On Monday, Year 6 took part in play leader training with Martin from FAVSP. They learned lots of practical skills and are now looking forward to putting them into action while leading games and activities on the KS1 playground at lunchtimes. Meanwhile, Year 5 have been making great progress in their guitar lessons. After learning how to take care of their instruments and the correct way to hold them, they have already mastered their first notes and even put them together to create a song!

In our Vine and Branches lessons, the class have been exploring the story of Moses and the Burning Bush. After reading the passage from the Bible, the children worked in pairs to retell the story. They made excellent links to prior learning and asked thoughtful questions about how this story connects with other parts of the Bible.

Thursday was a particularly busy day, with both a football competition and the St. Nich's Music Festival taking place. Our footballers demonstrated excellent sportsmanship on the pitch, while the choir gave an excellent performance that impressed everyone in attendance. Well done to all those who represented the class so well.


