Reader:

'Thomas was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, "We have seen the Lord", he answered, "Unless I see the holes that the nails made in His hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into His side, I refuse to believe."

Eight days later, the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed but Jesus came in and stood among them.

"Peace be with you," He said. Then He spoke to Thomas, "Put your finger here: look here are my hands. Doubt no longer but believe."

Thomas replied, "My Lord and my God!"

John 20:24-29

Prayer Leader:

At first, Thomas could not believe that Jesus had risen from the dead. He preferred the certainty of what he had seen with his own eyes – the crucifixion of Jesus - than to dare to believe in the good news of His resurrection. Perhaps that was too much of a risk.

Jesus shows Thomas the truth of His resurrection and gives him the courage to join in faith with the other disciples. In this way, he was brought into the group of believers.
