Learning Project WEEK 5 – Environment	
Year 3	
Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
BBC Bitesize Maths work for the week involves addition and subtraction for 3 digit numbers. The children have done a lot of work on this in class and some of these activities may be useful for consolidating. https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/levels/zbr9wmn	In class, our last class text was 'Song of the Dolphin Boy' by Elizabeth Laird. This book ties in nicely with the theme of the environment, as it is about a boy who wants to save the dolphins from all of the plastic in the ocean. This book is available on Amazon as an ebook.
The Oak Academy learning for the week revolves around fractions. This would be beneficial for the children to work through. MyMaths activities for the week will all be based on fractions to link with this learning. https://www.thenational.academy/online-classroom	The Oak Academy reading focus for the week is 'Instructions'. Children can work on reading comprehension tasks and use these to identify key aspects of instruction writing. They can then use this to write instructions for how to care for the environment. (See writing section). <u>https://www.thenational.academy/online-classroom</u>
 In addition to these learning resources, children can continue to work through the activities below each day: Working on <u>Times Table Rockstars</u> - your child will have an individual login to access this (20 mins on SOUND CHECK). If your child works on '<u>Numbots</u>' in school they can access this with the same login. Play on <u>Hit the Button</u> - focus on number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables. Adding totals of the weekly shopping list or some work around money. This game could support work on adding money. Practise telling the time. This could be done through this game (scroll down to access the game). Read to the quarter hour and the nearest 5 minutes. Ask your child to show everything they know about fractions so far. This can be done in shapes and also with objects and pictures. Be creative! Practise counting forwards and backwards from any given number in 5s. Don't forget to use your log in details to complete activities on MyMaths and Active Learn. With your child, look in magazines, newspapers and books for new vocabulary they are unfamiliar with. They could use a highlighter to highlight in magazines and newspapers. On our class discussion page on the website, some children have commented how they're enjoying Enid Blyton's 'The Magic Faraway Tree'. David Walliams books have also been mentioned as being very popular! Children can add any further recommendations to our class discussion. (3)

Weekly Spelling Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
 On Wednesday and Thursday, (29th and 30th April), BBC Bitesize lessons involve practicing spelling using apostrophes for contraction and possession. In addition, children can continue to work through the activities below: Practise the Year 3/4 for <u>Common Exception</u> words. Recently in class, we had done lots of work about plastic pollution and the children were extremely engaged and passionate about the subject. We watched some clips of David Attenborough's Blue Planet about how plastic is damaging the ocean environment. Other types of pollution are also covered in some of his episodes. If you have a Netflix account, Blue Planet is available to view on there. Alternatively, there are lots of short clips available on Youtube! Children could write a letter to David Attenborough, thanking him for all the work that he has done to raise awareness about caring for our planet. Linking on from the instruction tasks on Oak Academy, children could write instructions for how to take care of the environment. They could also present these instructions as a video advert. On Monday and Tuesday, (27th and 28th April), BBC Bitesize are providing lessons about adverbs and sentence writing. https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/levels/zbr9wmn Children could draw a scientific diagram of the water cycle then add labels and captions to explain how it works. In class, the children enjoyed listening and singing along to the water cycle song below. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=TWb4KIM2vts This writing and drawing activity could be carried out after the Science lesson on BBC Bitesize on States of Matter on Wednesday 29th April. Write a letter to be sent to local schools explaining why children should support local charities if they can and help those who are in need. Design a poster that either expresses the importance of recycling, not dropping litter or another UK environmental issue. Can they think of a catchy slogan to accompany their design? Write a diary entry to a family member telling them all about how their day or week has been. Take part in a writing master class. Write a book review for one of the books they have read. Remember to say what they have enjoyed or not and

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about the environment. Learning may focus on changes to different environments, the impact of humans on environments, climate change etc.

Let's Wonder:

What is the weather like around the world? Which countries are most likely to have a snowstorm, torrential rain, heatwaves etc Find out about natural disasters such as forest fires, earthquakes, tsunamis, floods, tornados etc..... How is climate change having an effect on the weather and natural disasters?

Let's Create:

Using recycled materials design and make a recycling mascot to spread the word about the importance and need to recycle. Think about what it is going to look like? Which materials are they going to use? How are they going to join the materials together? Once completed, remember to evaluate their mascot. What would they do differently next time? Which parts did they find the most challenging and why?

There are lots of creative and ideas and lessons being shared on The Oak Academy website. Activities include building a terrarium and creating nature bugs.

Be Active:

Get into the garden and practise throwing and catching skills and keeping control of ball-based equipment like bats and balls.

Recommendation at least 2 hours of exercise a week.

After completing the lessons, children could get active by exploring the plants in their garden/ the local environment on their daily walk. They could even plant some of their own in different conditions as an experiment!

Time to Talk:

Discuss environmental issues in the UK. Air pollution, climate change, litter, waste, and soil contamination are all examples of human activity that have an impact in the UK. What are the global environmental issues? Various processes that can be said to contribute to the global environmental problems include pollution, global warming, ozone depletion, acid rain, depletion of natural resources, overpopulation, waste disposal and deforestation ... These processes have a highly negative impact on our environment. Decide as a family how they could 'do their bit' to look after their environment e.g. you could set up a recycling station in their home; Paper, plastics and glass.

The BBC Bitesize website has some good short videos about the environment and how humans impact the environment. Renewable and non-renewable energy is also introduced.

Understanding Others and Appreciating Differences:

Throughout our lives, culture and experience shapes worldviews, children growing up in the Netherlands, for example, have a much different understanding of the role of water in their lives than their peers in the Sahara Desert. The difference between the abundance and scarcity of water in each of these physical environments affects every aspect of their











respective cultures, including the global perceptions they will carry with them throughout their lives. Think about food. How do they think people view food in the UK compared to those living in Ethiopia for example? Research a country where food and water are scarce. Find out about charities that help people in need, <u>Red cross</u>, <u>Christain</u> <u>Aid</u>, <u>Islamic Relief</u> or other charities that are significant to them.
