Across the school, **32 minutes** of learning time was lost this week through late arrivals.

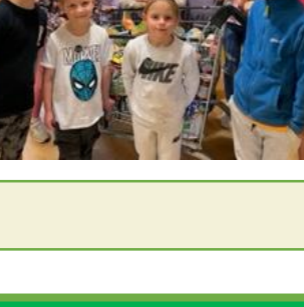
Don't underestimate the importance of 100% attendance. Even one day missed can have an effect on learning.

Please be aware that requests for children to take holidays during term time will be classed as an unauthorised absence.

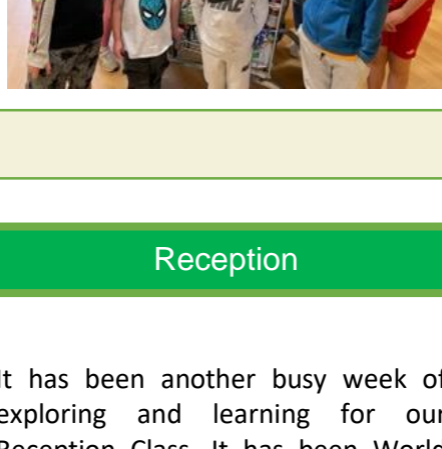

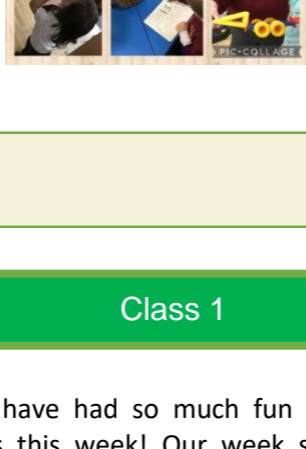


Reception

It has been another busy week of exploring and learning for our Reception Class. It has been World Space Week this week and we have really enjoyed learning about space and creating constellations using marshmallows.

We have also continued with Harvest festival celebrations and, after hearing about combine harvesters in a poem, some of our classmates created their own using the small construction resources.

Alongside all of the special celebrations this week, we have also been working with numbers up to 3 and sorting the 'rubbish' into different types of materials.

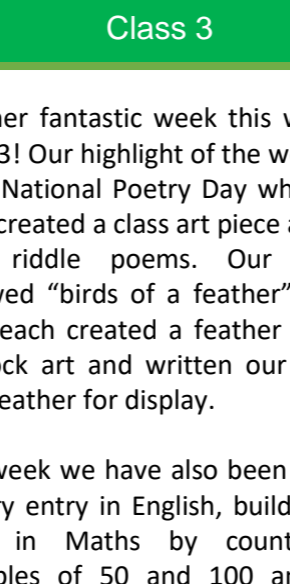
Class 2

In Maths we have been able to use greater than and less than symbols to identify bigger and smaller numbers. Now we can even position these correctly on a number line.

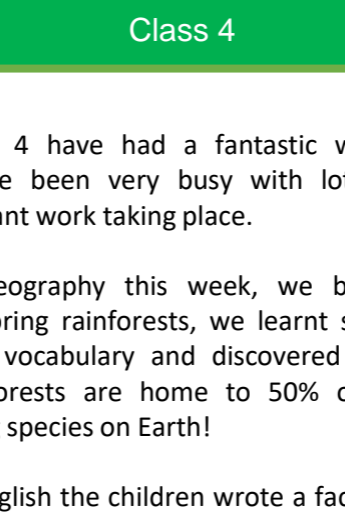

Class 4

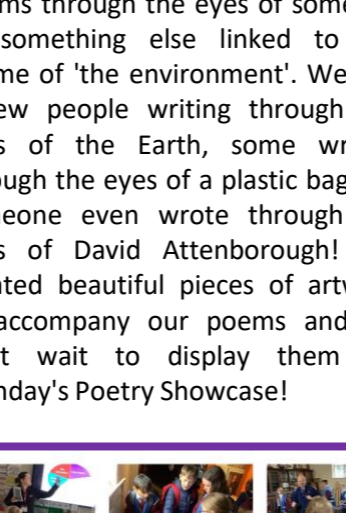
Class 4 have had a fantastic week. We've been very busy with lots of brilliant work taking place.

In addition, we continued our work on place value in maths, in religion we thought about the challenges Abraham and Sarah faced and this week's prayer & liturgy was about Harvest.

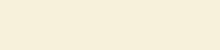


Class 5

Class 6

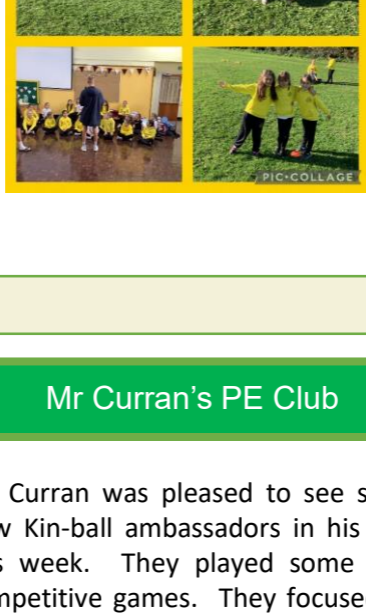
Another great week in Year 6 this week- we have been non-stop since Monday!

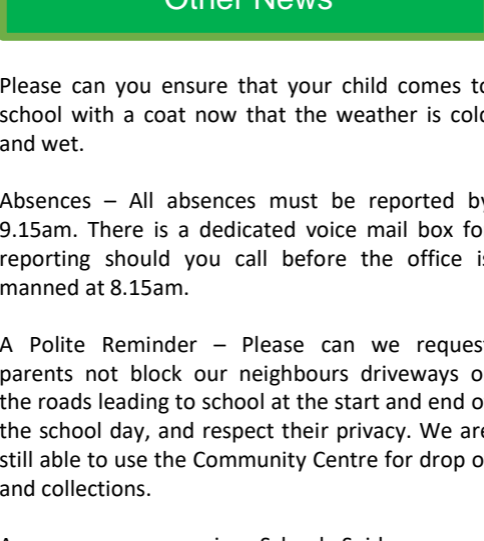
Chester Mini Marathon
